NOTE: There is no longer a food stall on Wednesdays and Thursdays on Kings Road.

- **COMPUTERS**

We now have computers for people to use at our hubs for sending emails, making appointments, searching helpful websites etc (but not playing games!).

We also have computers and helpers to help people who cannot 'do' computers. Do you know anyone who would benefit from this? No one is too old. We want to help all Sandiacre get online.

- **We need volunteers** who can help us to achieve our vision of building a stronger, safer, healthier, happier Sandiacre. Just a few minutes here and there can help. Come and talk to us if you want to know more.
- **KINGS ROAD IS CLOSED** from 6-14 October for sewer works, there is only access from both ends, no through route.
- **TACKLING CRIME IN SANDIACRE**

Many have shown support for the Neighbourhood Watch Community Safety Charter.

Which is:

1. **PROMOTE** a culture that does not tolerate antisocial behaviour, harassment, intimidation and hostility towards others.
2. **ENABLE** others to identify and take an active stance against these crimes and incidents.
3. **REPORT:** Actively encourage and support those who experience or witness these crimes and incidents to report them to the relevant authorities.

4. **SUPPORT** those affected and signpost those who need further support to agencies who can help them.

What do we mean by 'street harassment'?

By street harassment, we mean unwanted behaviour in public areas that includes, but is not exclusive of:

- **unsolicited sexualised or offensive comments or gestures**
- **unwanted whistling or honking,**
- **so-called 'catcalling'**
- **indecent exposure**
- **stalking or being followed**
- **intrusive staring**
- **persistent sexual advances,**
- **unwanted touching**
- **being insulted or shouted at or**
- **feeling physically threatened.**

Public areas include streets, shopping centres, public transport (e.g., buses, trains, etc.), hospitality venues (e.g., pubs, clubs, bars, etc.), public events (e.g., concerts, sports games, festivals, etc.), parks, commons, and other public recreational spaces.

We see our hub at the Coffee Mornings playing a big part in helping people to reduce crime in Sandiacre.

Our hub is a Safe Place where we can talk, report, escape and learn.

If you witness an incident, only when it is safe, ask the victim: 'Are you OK?'

Very often incidents happen when people are about. Asking this question gives the opportunity to tell them there is such a thing as victim support and to give the message: You are not alone.

We want to learn together how we can help without putting ourselves at risk.
